10	All district staff and students must be prepared to respond quickly and responsibly to
11	emergencies, disasters, and events which threaten to result in a disaster.
12	
13	The superintendent or designee shall develop and maintain a district crisis plan which
14	details provisions for handling foreseeable emergencies and disasters. It is recommended
15	that this plan be reviewed and updated regularly.
16	
17	Principals shall augment the district plan with working site crisis plans and appropriate
18	procedures specific to each school building/site. All students and employees shall receive
19	appropriate instruction regarding these procedures.
20	The superintendent or designed shall consult with site and (or county econsise of that
21 22	The superintendent or designee shall consult with city and/or county agencies so that district and site plans may provide the best possible way of handling each situation. These
22 23	consultations should also consider emergency communications systems between these
23 24	
24 25	agencies and each district school.
23 26	District and site plans shall address, but will not be limited to, the following situations:
27	District and site plans shan address, but will not be miniced to, the following situations.
28	1. Fire in a building.
29	2. Fire from an external source, i.e., brush, grass, or forest fires.
30	3. Bomb threats or actual events.
31	4. Natural disasters, i.e., floods, severe weather, or earthquakes.
32	5. Man-made disasters, i.e., riots, accidents involving aircraft, or hazardous materials.
33	6. Threats, attacks, or disturbances from groups or individuals.
34	7. Other threats to students' health and safety, i.e., suicide.
35	······································
36	The board shall grant the use of school buildings, grounds and equipment to public
37	agencies, including the American Red Cross, for mass care and welfare shelters during
38	disasters or other emergencies affecting the public health and welfare. The board shall co-
39	operate with such agencies in furnishing and maintaining whatever services it deems
40	necessary to meet the community's needs.
41	
42	Crisis plan teams shall meet annually at each district site to review the crisis plan and
43	develop the sites drill schedule.
44	
45	The board encourages all employees to become proficient in first aid, cardiopulmonary
46	resuscitation and the Automated Emergency Defibrillator (AED). Each principal shall
47	encourage staff members at each school to hold valid certificates in these areas.
